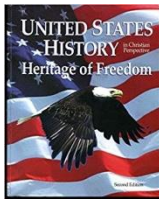
American History, Part 2 (9th through 12th grade)

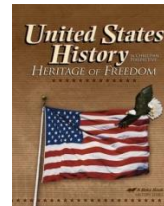
