World Literature Classics (9th through 10th grade)

Course Description: The study of world literature, takes students on a journey through different time periods and cultures. Through these classic works, students are exposed to the timeless archetype of the hero. We see how the ideal of the **hero** has developed over time and even into today. These works are all contrasted with the backdrop of the Biblical worldview of heroes and religion of the time period that shows through in the literature. In this course, students will study different classic novels and epics from world literature covering a variety of authors. Literary analysis paragraphs, essays, and research papers will be written on the assigned readings. Students will be expected to read the assigned text, write papers, research, and document information from credible secondary sources.

Internet access for research, an email address to communicate with the instructor, and Google Drive account is required to share information and papers between the instructor and students. Students must have access at home to a computer/laptop/iPad and the internet for this class. Students are required to bring a laptop/iPad to class. Grades and assignments will be shared through Edmodo.

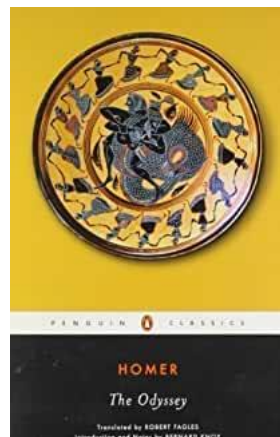
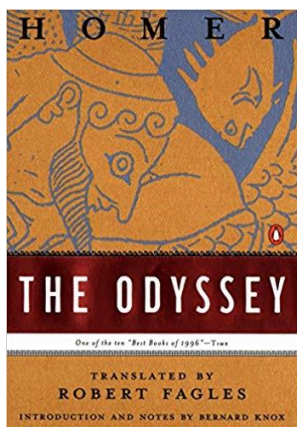
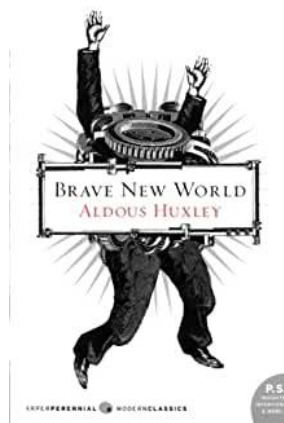
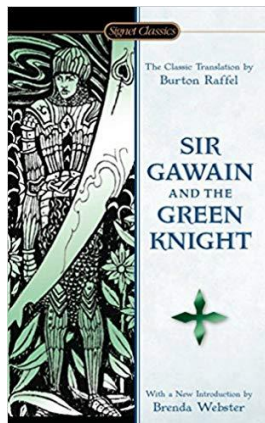
Tuition and Fees:
